Ben was taken on his final ride through the streets of Denver on Friday, 28 Dec 2001, to his resting place at Ft Logan National Cemetery. It was a long procession of cars and trucks filled with family and friends paying tribute to him and ended with a 21-gun salute and taps provided by the Buckley AFB Honor Guard. Although he is no longer with us, this alumni association is a living tribute to him. Ben started it with the first alumni national reunion here at the DoubleTree Hotel in 1989. In February 1991 we had our first official alumni breakfast meeting and started collecting dues from the membership. We followed that with the first alumni picnic in the summer of 1991, and since then we hosted another national reunion here in 1996 and a third last year in June 2001. The picnic has become an annual event and we have also had an annual fall evening social since 1998. We would not be a group of AFTAC alumni here in Colorado without Ben's efforts over the last 12 years and in November 2001 we recognized his contributions by presenting him a plaque at his home in Aurora with his family. 
God saw he was getting tired, And a cure was not to be. So He put His arms around him, And whispered, "Come with me."

# From the West Coast Chapter – The Depot Fallout

Frank Goodreau's E-mail: Hi all, Here is a book about AFTAC and related groups, if you are interested. It's been around since 1995, so you may have a copy. Spying without Spies: Origins of America's Secret Nuclear Surveillance System by Charles A. Ziegler and David Jacobson. Praeger Publishers, 88 Post Road, Westport, Connecticut 06881, 1995, 242 pages. Spying without Spies deals with how the United States detected the first atomic explosion deep inside the Soviet Union in 1949-a subject that up until now has remained hidden from the American people. The Manhattan Engineer District ran the first rudimentary detection system on Germany in 1944 using A-26s with xenon-detection equipment. Manhattan Engineer District was the cover name assigned to the Army organization that designed, built, and tested the first atomic bombs. At the end of the war, no one was sure how or if the US could even detect atomic events deep inside the Soviet Union. This book tells how scientists, intelligence officials, Air Force officers, and commissioners of the Atomic Energy Commission (AEC) grappled with the problem. The book also provides an understanding of how national security decisions were made in the early postwar years.
