



Regardless of the specialty area of each person, we performed, and continue to perform, in an incredible example of teamwork and dedication to accomplish our missions. It is exemplary to recognize the degree of commitment that every one who has been part of our fraternity has shown to guarding the security of our very existence for decades. The many families who could only stare at us when we would leave without being able to tell them where, for how long, and what we would be doing pressed hard upon us to give them some assurance that all was ok. 2:00 AM incoming calls to leave immediately put many strains on relationships. Preparing for that call with regard to all the other

things that revolved around our daily lives was second nature. "Why are you doing that?" could only be met with an assuring smile and usually a request for them to take care of some task that we usually accomplished. We disappeared in much the same way that many fictional characters in novels and movies of the Cold War era did. And this wasn't about only those with long terms of service. We were all the way from 18 year olds who were barely out of the fun of high school through men who had fought in WW II and Korea, some of who had seen the enemy up close with a bayonet pointed into their gut. Yet this was, and is, a mission that none took lightly. We knew that it was not a game. The lives of millions of people all over the earth unknowingly placed themselves and their future in our hands. And today there are millions who are going through daily life because of our commitment. God bless all of those in the past, present, and future carrying on this mission.

What we need from you: mark your calendars now for 13 – 16 June 2013, register early by completing the reunion registration form and returning it along with your check, reserve your hotel room by calling the DoubleTree by Hilton Hotel Denver-Aurora, or by going to the hotel website (see the hotel information sheet for details). And, please pass the word along to other alumni who might not be members of any of the alumni chapters. Membership in an alumni chapter is not required to attend the reunion. Early registration will allow better planning by the reunion committee and some planned activities are tentative depending on the responses we get on the registration forms. If you have any questions, please contact one of the committee members listed at the bottom of this page.

<u>Hospitality Room:</u> We will have a hospitality room in the DoubleTree Hotel open daily beginning Thursday afternoon, 13 June. This where you sign in and pick up your welcome package if not available in the hotel lobby. Look for the alumni welcome table in the otel lobby and for information on the electronic sign board.as to the hospitality room location. Name tags will be provided in the welcome package so please list names on the registration form as you want them to appear on the tags.

<u>Det 418 Mini-Reunion Thursday afternoon/evening, 13 June:</u> There will be a mini-reunion for Det 418 alumni in conjunction with the main reunion. People attending this mini-reunion must return the registration form the same as those attending the main reunion. Additional information on this event is being provided by Frank Calenda. Golf Outing, Friday morning, 14 June: This is a tentative item depending on the number of people signing up for it, and if held will be at the Heather Ridge Country Club, now a public course, just a few blocks from the DoubleTree hotel. It will be arranged by Lonnie Gibbons with shuttle bus transportation available from the hotel. Cost is listed at \$40 each on the registration form and refunds will be made if the actual cost is less or the event is cancelled due to lack of interest. Please note that rental clubs at the golf course are very limited. NOTE: Golf cost includes 18 holes "with golf cart."

Wings Over the Rockies Museum, Friday morning/afternoon, 14 June: This is also a tentative item depending on the number of people signing up for it. The museum is located in one of the large hangars on the former Lowry AFB just a few blocks from the former Det 57 and SPINSTRA schoolhouse, Bldgs 358 & 359. We will attempt to arrange hotel shuttle bus transportation but this is subject to availability. Museum admission cost is \$ 9.00 for seniors (65+), veterans, and active duty to be paid at the museum. www.wingsmuseum.com

<u>Det 45 Operations Tour, Buckley AFB, Saturday morning, 15 June:</u> The detachment will provide tour escorts and a show and tell of their satellite operations area. This is inside a restricted area, so additional personal information will be required to obtain visitor clearance. Transportation will be provided from the hotel for those who need it.

<u>Reception Icebreaker, Friday evening, 14 June:</u> DoubleTree Hotel, AFTAC Ballroom, informal mixer with mixed hors d'oeuvres buffet, including Teriyaki beef and pulled pork skewers, and cash bar. Dress is casual.

Reunion Banquet, Saturday evening, 15 June: DoubleTree Hotel, AFTA C Ballroom, social with cash bar followed by sit-down dinner with choice of Prime Rib, French Cut Chicken Florentine, or Atlantic Salmon entrees. Guest speaker to be announced.

Hotel Information

AFTAC – Long Range Detection Alumni Worldwide Reunion 13 - 16 June 2013 (Includes Det 418 Mini-Reunion on 13 June) Aurora, Colorado

The reunion is being held at the DoubleTree by Hilton Hotel Denver-Aurora, 13696 E. Iliff Place, Aurora, CO 80014-1319. The hotel web site is www.doubletreedenveraurorahotel.com and the telephone number is 303-337-2800. The toll free number is 800-445-8667. You can make reservations using any of these three avenues. Check-In time is 3 PM. Should you arrive early, an early check-in is possible as rooms become available. The hotel has a secure room for your luggage should you arrive early. Check-out time is 12 Noon.

A special group room rate of \$89.00 (total including tax is \$99.99) per night is available for reunion attendees. The hotel has provided a block of rooms, including three ADA accessible rooms on the first floor, at this rate for the period 11 to 18 June which allows reunion attendees to check in and check out on any dates during this period. Each room has either one king size or two full size beds, and the special group rate includes single or double occupancy. Triple occupancy is an additional \$5.00 and quad is \$10.00. Included with this special group rate is a complimentary full breakfast buffet each morning in the hotel dining room and in-room high-speed internet access (HSIA).

Reservations must be confirmed by 24 May to get the special rate, or until the block of rooms is sold out. Therefore, please make your reservations as early as possible so we can monitor our contractual obligations with the hotel and obtain additional room blocks as needed. When contacting the hotel for reservations, be sure to request the special group rate code "TAC" which is the special \$89.00 rate for AFTAC reunion attendees (including Det 418 mini-reunion attendees). If using the internet to make reservations, go to the hotel web site and on the home page left side enter the arrival, departure, and room information then click on the Add Special Rate Codes and then enter TAC in the Group Code Block, then click on Check Availability. This will take you to the next page which will show the three types of rooms at the special \$89.00 group rate. The complimentary breakfast and in-room HSIA are not shown as included with this rate, but these are in fact included and if making reservations by telephone, the agent can confirm this. However, please note that if you book your room using any other special rate or group code, e.g., AARP, Senior, Govt, etc., you will not get the free breakfast buffet or HSIA. Also, please note that the hotel will add a customary early departure fee if you check out of the hotel prior to your reserved check-out date unless you advise the hotel at or before check-in of any change in your planned length of stay. The hotel should also inform you of the potential charge at your time of check-in.

The hotel provides daily shuttle service to and from Denver International Airport (DIA). The pickup point is on the baggage level of the **East Terminal** outside **Door 511** at **Island #3** at the hotel pickup signs. Call the hotel front desk at their local number 303-337-2800 to inform guest services/driver that you are at the airport and get an estimated shuttle arrival time. Please be sure to board the white van with the large DoubleTree by Hilton Cookie on the side and marked **DoubleTree Denver-Aurora**. Space is limited on the airport shuttle, so you should also schedule your departure time with the front desk for return to DIA when you check in to the hotel. The hotel also offers limited local shuttle service within a five mile radius of the hotel based upon availability. This can include the University of Colorado Medical Center on the Fitzsim ons campus, the Aurora Town Center and Mall, and the RTD light rail station at Parker Road and I-225 amongst other attractions. Additional information on the shuttle service is available at the hotel front desk, and information on other hotel amenities and many local area attractions is available at the hotel and on the hotel web site.
